In 2017, ISRO chief Dr. K. Kasthuri Rangan formed a committee to formulate a new education policy. The draft of the National Education policy was presented by this committee in the year 2019. This new educational policy will replace the 36 year old educational policy.

The new National Education policy 2020 has set its goal at the universalization of education from pre-nursery to higher education with 100% GER by the year 2030. This new educational policy has made some changes which includes higher education in foreign

The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi approved the National Education Policy 2020. This new policy aims to pave the way for transformational reforms in school and higher education systems in the country. It was built on the foundational pillars of - Access, Equity, Quality, Affordability and Accountability, this policy is aligned to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The new NEP has replaced school education 10+2 format with 5+3+3+4. The policy has emphasized mother tongue / local / regional language as the medium of instruction at least till Grade 5, but preferably till Grade 8. A dedicated unit to orchestrate the building of digital infrastructure, digital content and capacity building will be created in the MHRD to look after the e-education needs to both school and higher education. Emphasis on Foundational Literacy and Numeracy, no rigid separation between academic streams, extracurricular, vocational streams in schools; Vocational education to start from Class 6 with Internships. Assessment reforms with 360-degree Holistic Progress Card, tracking student progress for achieving Learning Outcomes.

Gross Enrollment Ratio in higher education to be raised to 50% by 2035, 3.5 crore seats to be added in higher education. UG education can be of 3 or 4 years with multiple exit options and appropriate certification within this period. Academic Bank of Credits to be established to facilitate Transfer of Credits (MERU)

is set at par with IITs, IIMs, to be as a model of best multidisciplinary education of global standards in the country. (NETF) National Educational Technology Forum, will be created to provide a platform for the free exchange of ideas on the use of technology to enhance learning, assessment, planning, administration. NEP 2020 emphasises setting up of Gender Inclusion Fund; Special Education zones for disadvantaged regions and groups. The Centre and the States will work together to increase the public investment in the Education sector to reach 6% of GDP at the earliest.

To conclude the essay on New Education Policy 2020, we can say that this policy is an essential initiative to help in the all-round development of our society & country as well. However, the implementation of this policy will greatly determine its success.
