15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary
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Our college is deeply committed to its stated Vision and Mission, ensuring that all academic programmes reflect these principles and goals. Each programme is designed to comply with the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) framework, promoting academic flexibility and holistic education. This system empowers students to choose courses from a diverse range of disciplines, encouraging a more learner-centric approach to education. Since 2020, our institution has fully adopted the guidelines of the National Education Policy (NEP), as mandated by our affiliation with Bangalore University. This transition to NEP compliance has strengthened the multidisciplinary focus of our programmes, allowing students to opt for interdisciplinary courses that enrich their learning experience and broaden their academic horizons. Additionally, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a pivotal role in fostering a culture of academic excellence and collaboration. The IQAC supports and organizes various initiatives, such as workshops, seminars, and conferences, in multidisciplinary and emerging domains. These

activities provide a platform for students and faculty to engage in meaningful discussions, explore innovative ideas, and enhance their knowledge beyond the boundaries of their primary disciplines. This integrated approach not only adheres to the regulatory frameworks but also aligns with the institution's goal of nurturing well-rounded individuals who are prepared to meet the challenges of the modern world.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Yes, our institution has adopted the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP). The ABC facilitates student mobility across higher education institutions by allowing them to accumulate, transfer, and redeem credits earned across various programs and institutions. The following initiatives are undertaken: Registration with ABC: Our institution is registered with the Academic Bank of Credits platform provided by the Ministry of Education. All relevant student and course data are integrated into the system. Implementation of CBCS: The institution has adopted the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) across all programs, enabling seamless integration with ABC. Credit Accumulation and Transfer: Students can earn credits from various institutions and transfer them to ABC, ensuring flexibility in education and compliance with NEP standards. Awareness Campaigns: Faculty, students, and administrative staff are regularly oriented about the ABC framework, its benefits, and procedures through workshops and seminars.

17.Skill development:

As part of its skill development initiatives, the IQAC at Dayananda Sagar College of Arts, Science, and Commerce (DSCASC) has introduced various events and programs aimed at enhancing student competencies beyond the regular syllabus. Since the HEI is affiliated with Bangalore University, changing the syllabus is not possible. Therefore, students are offered add-on programs by the institution to enhance their learning experience. To cater to diverse educational needs, Bangalore University provides a selection of elective subjects for students. Additionally, it is mandatory for final-year students to undertake live projects as part of their respective programs, fostering hands-on learning experiences. DSCASC has signed MOUs with reputed companies under the guidance of IQAC, enabling students to gain industry-relevant skills. To further develop students' capabilities, the institution has a fully functioning NSS office led by a dedicated NSS officer, who oversees activities that contribute to societal

and personal growth. For mindful learning, the Yoga Cell conducts regular yoga and meditation sessions, promoting mental well-being and focus. Beyond the regular curriculum, students are encouraged to pursue MOOC certifications through platforms like NPTEL and SWAYAM. These initiatives are mandatory, ensuring that students acquire additional knowledge and skills that align with global standards.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

We are encouraging our faculty and students to actively engage in integrating the Indian Knowledge System (IKS). The IQAC has already initiated this effort and aims to deliver impactful results in the near future. However, at Dayananda Sagar College of Arts, Science, and Commerce (DSCASC), we have taken proactive measures to promote IKS through a variety of extracurricular and co-curricular activities organized under the aegis of our Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and its associated centers. These initiatives aim to blend traditional Indian wisdom with modern education, fostering holistic development and a deeper appreciation for India's rich heritage. Initiatives

Promoting IKS Language and Literary Cell: Conducts events that celebrate regional and classical Indian languages and literature, such as poetry recitation, storytelling, and debates highlighting Indian philosophies and values. Organizes workshops and guest lectures on ancient Indian texts like the Vedas, Upanishads, and Sanskrit literature.

Student Activity Cell: Facilitates cultural events and competitions showcasing traditional Indian art forms, music, and dance. Promotes awareness of Indian festivals, traditions, and indigenous knowledge through exhibitions and interactive sessions.

Yoga Cell: Conducts regular yoga sessions, emphasizing its ancient Indian roots and benefits for physical, mental, and spiritual well-being. Organizes workshops on the science of pranayama and traditional healing practices rooted in Indian traditions.

Meditation Cell: Offers guided meditation sessions inspired by Indian techniques such as Vipassana and mindfulness. Educates students and staff on the significance of meditation in Indian philosophy as a tool for self-awareness and inner peace.

Study Centers: We have had study centers named after Buddha, Mahatma Gandhi, Vivekananda, and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar operating for the past four years, focusing on exploring their values and contributions.

The HEI is primarily an offline institution, though it also offers certain classes online. Given that many students come from different parts of India and a few from abroad, they often return to their hometowns mid-semester. To engage students, the institution conducts bridge courses before the commencement of regular offline classes. Additionally, cells associated with the IQAC organize events and encourage student participation through online platforms. The HEI also promotes student involvement in MOOC programs and has signed MOUs with organizations to offer both offline and online certification courses.

Advanced learners are encouraged to excel through paper presentations, enriching their research skills, and MOOC courses, which expand their knowledge beyond the curriculum while providing valuable certifications. Enrichment activities and competitions foster critical thinking, creativity, and collaboration, ensuring advanced learners remain motivated and engaged.

A diagnostic test is conducted at the start of the program to assess student proficiency, followed by bridge courses coordinated for those needing additional support. Post-course assessments evaluate the bridge course's effectiveness and help identify slow and advanced learners. Advanced learners are guided to participate in management fests, pursue certification programs, and receive preparation for high-salary campus placements. By promoting academic and co-curricular activities, the institution ensures the holistic development of all students, reflecting its commitment to enhancing educational standards and fostering growth for every learner.

The college conducts two internal tests as per the academic calendar, with the best score from the two contributing to the final grade.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

Dayananda Sagar College of Arts, Science, and Commerce follows Bangalore University's examination criteria, with end-semester exams comprising 70 external and 30 internal assessment marks for each paper. The internal assessment, a continuous evaluation process, includes class tests, assignments, projects, and presentations. Two internal tests are scheduled per academic calendar, with the better score of the two used for final grading. Teachers also administer unit tests, which may include written exams, PowerPoint presentations, quizzes, and problem-solving exercises, allowing assessment based on comprehensive subject knowledge.

Internal test results are displayed in classrooms, and students can review their assessment copies and inquire about their performance. Marks are recorded in the institution's database. Any grade discrepancies can be quickly addressed, and students are shown their evaluated assessments by the subject faculty, who explain the valuation scheme beforehand. In practical subjects, faculty discuss solutions and teach students the method of approaching problems. To promote transparency, peer exchange of test copies for observation is sometimes practiced.
